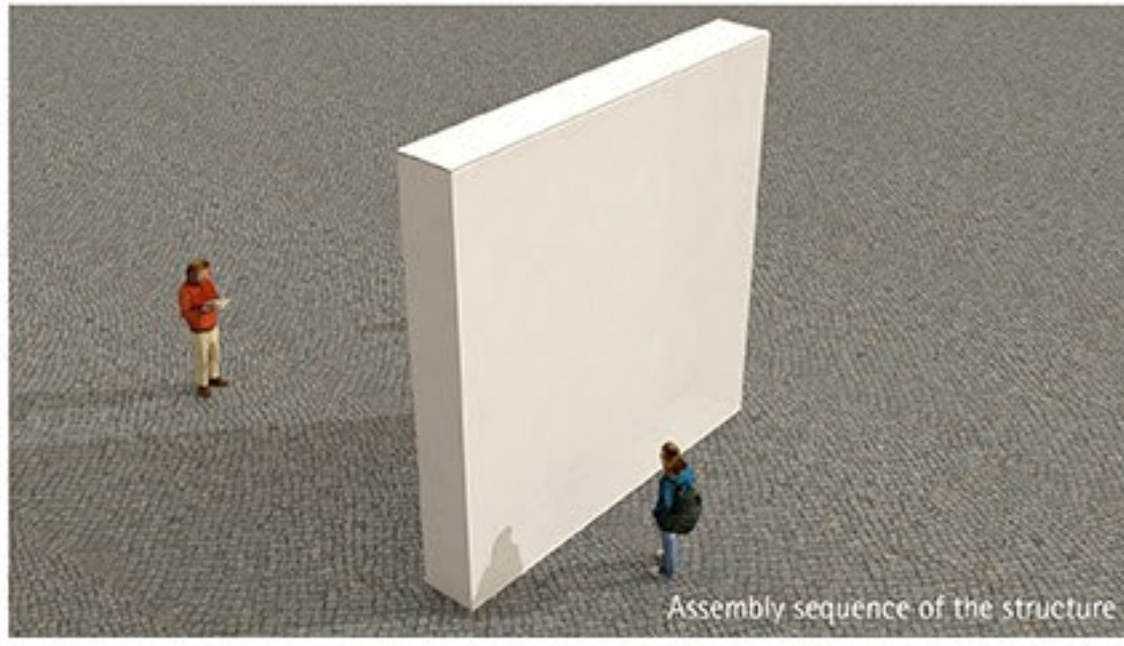
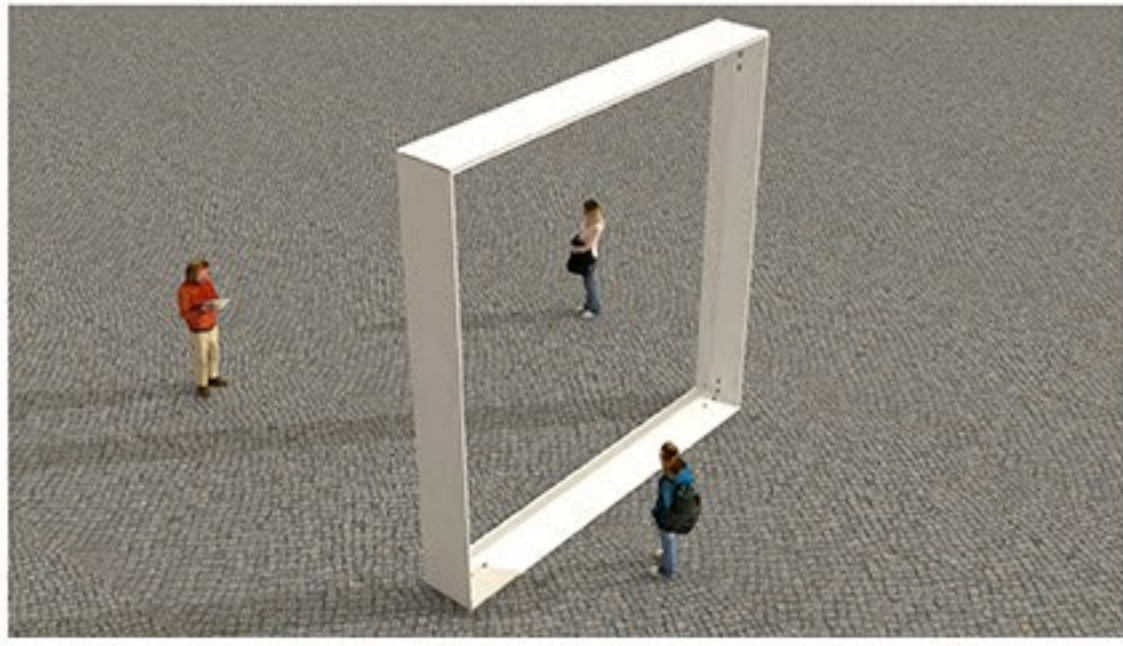
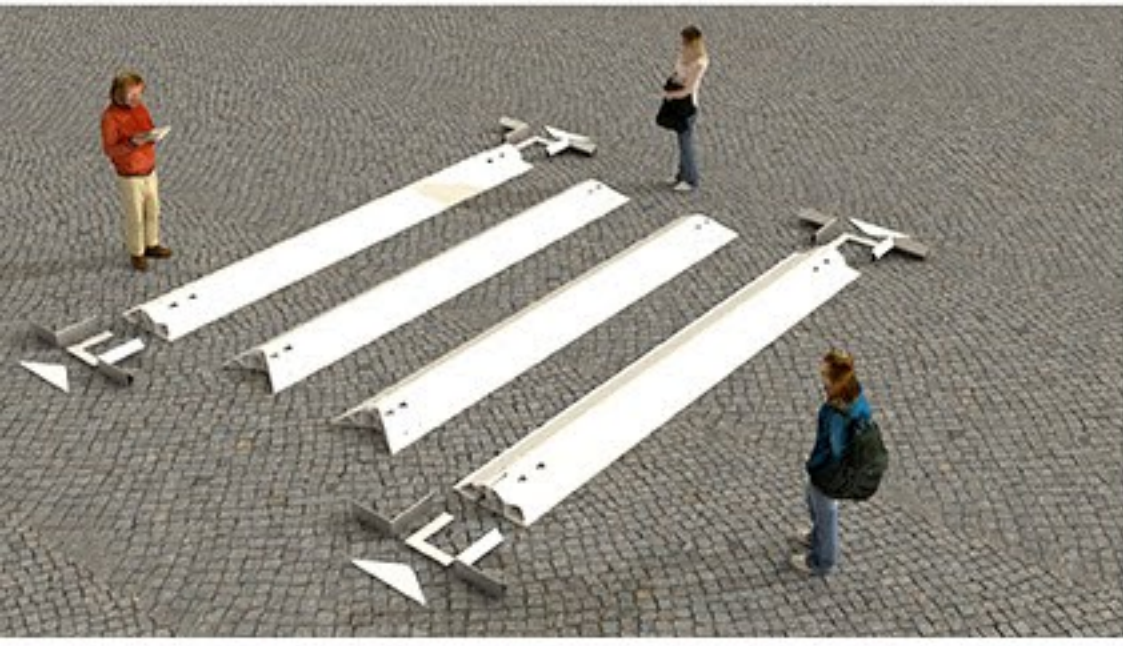


Section detail scale 1/2



Square Moon A window to Innisfree

Square Moon is a temporary structure to be located at the lake isle of Innisfree of Lough Gill, Sligo. Made of extruded aluminum profile, it can be delivered to the site as a small package and can be assembled easily on site by untrained personnel with minimum efforts.

During the day, its window or portal like profile frames the landscape of Innisfree and creates a 'field' for activities such as poetry reading and play. In the evening, this structure transforms into a 'Lantern' for more dramatic events such as shadow play and backdrop for various theatrical activities. Concealed screen within the aluminum profile will unroll down and fixed at the base. As the light source, large candles will be used and LED light source would be considered if access to the electricity can be acquired.

Since the design is modular and made of linear components, the delivery to the island wouldn't require a special or large boat. Once arrived at designated location, base plate with a couple of piles will be laid on the ground and rest of the structure then assembled on top of it.

Small foot print for this structure ensures that this structure would cause minimum disturbances to the existing ecology of isle of Innisfree and leave no trace of it.

Its platonic and minimal appearance will not only give somewhat mysterious presence in the nature, but also befit in more urban setting when relocated after its expected period of usage.
